<b>Christ Church</b>	Installation of <b>laundry area and shower</b> stall in the Christ Church hall, which will be utilized by Elizabeth Fry clients who will be occupying the modular units installed on Church property.	\$6,990
<b>Coverdale Courtwork Society</b>	<b>Client Support Funding:</b> to deliver prevention and shelter diversion services for women and gender diverse individuals who are experiencing the criminal justice system and homelessness.	\$32,000

<b>The Mi'kmaw Native Friendship Centre</b>	<b>Two Intensive Case Managers:</b> Support to Indigenous individuals who are considered chronically homeless, fit the MNFC's mandate and a high acuity to find and maintain housing. <b>Family Case Manager:</b> Supports Indigenous families who have a higher acuity, experiencing homelessness and fit the MNFC mandate to find and maintain housing.	\$230,393
<b>North End Community Health Centre (MOSH Housing First)</b>	<b>Four Intensive Case Managers:</b> Supports individuals with high acuity, complex needs, and experiencing chronic homelessness find and maintain housing.	\$621,260
<b>The Governing Council of The Salvation Army</b>	<b>Intensive Case Manager:</b> Support individuals who identify as male, age 19+ and who are chronically homeless find and maintain housing.	\$81,168
<b>Shelter Nova Scotia</b>	<b>Herring Cove Apartments:</b> 24/7 staff to support individuals who have experienced chronic homelessness, and are alcohol dependent.  <b>The Hub:</b> Support to individuals in the community experiencing homelessness, precariously housed or those who have recently transitioned to housing. This support is provided through an <b>Intensive Case Manager:</b> working with individuals with a high acuity. And through a <b>Diversion worker:</b> who provides support to those experiencing housing insecurity or homelessness.	\$668,215  \$179,671
<b>Welcome Housing and Support Services</b>	<b>Navigation/Diversion Worker:</b> Support individuals in need of housing and support services, including prevention and shelter diversion assistance. Will	\$104,900

	provide this support in Dartmouth, Cole Harbour, Sackville, Spryfield and surrounding areas.	
<b>Young Women's Cristian Association of Halifax (YWCA)</b>	Funding to provide programs that include supportive housing for young mothers and single adult women. Assisting women transition from homelessness to permanent housing in the community and YWCA scattered site housing.	\$140,005
